*	1-3	50 days	Counting of the Omer Lev 23:15-16	Instruction to Count 50 days from FirstFruits to Pentecost. Sense of anticipation from a small FirstFruits to beginning of substantial harvest (at Pentecost) from the ground and seed that had been dead.	Physical redemption from Egypt was great, but God wanted to show Israel that it was not useful long-term without an infusion of spiritual power from God as well. Believing Jesus, without baptism of Spirit, means little spiritual fruit or power.
4	3	circa 5th	Feast of Weeks Lev 23:17-22 Shavuot	After Counting 7 weeks plus a day (50 days), offer 2 loaves of bread made WITH LEAVEN as a wave offering. This is also called by God a "FirstFruits" offering.	DISCIPLES FILLED WITH HOLY SPIRIT (PENTECOST) - Acts 2. A "wave" offering visually presents the idea of belonging to God, being elevated beyond the normal life on earth, but yet still connected to earth. Jew & Gentile, though born in sin, can now be lifted from "normal" earthly life by power of The Spirit - We hold this treasure (the Holy Spirit) in earthen vessels (1 Cor 4:7)... ALSO, harvest of 3000
*	4,5,6		NO FEASTS	Summer of tending the soil, seed sowing, watering, and harvesting.	Jesus set us free from the death of winter. From the Spring (of New Life) that He initiated with His Resurrection, until the Final Harvest, we are to tend the soil (we are but dust), plant seeds of the Gospel, water with prayer, and harvest souls.
5	7	1	Feast of Trumpets Lev 23:23-25 Yom Teruah	No agricultural connection. You are to take a day off to shout and blow trumpets. Do a "normal" offering to the Lord. Served as a warning that Day of Atonement was close at hand.	This feast is THE WARNING that Judgment is close at hand. This is NOT "The Rapture". These are the FIRST trumpets to sound, the rapture is at the FINAL Trumpet.
6	7	10	Day of Atonement Lev 23:26-32 Yom Kippur	NINE times in these 7 verses God gives instruction to HUMBLE ourselves before Him and do NO work on THIS day. In fact, the Hebrew says on "ONLY AND EXACTLY THIS DAY" is THE Day of Atonement. Elsewhere in The Torah (Leviticus 16) YAHOVAH commands that ONLY on this day of the year, and ONLY with the blood of the sacrifices He commands ONLY the High Priest can enter the Holy of Holies as the ONLY place make atonement for himself, The Tabernacle/Temple and the people of Israel.	Zech 12:10ff - In humbleness, those Jewish people who remain will mourn bitterly for the wounds they had put upon Yeshua - Jesus, and YehovAh will "pour out a spirit of grace" for "He resists the proud but gives grace to the Humble (Jacob 4:6)" Zech 13:1 says, "YehovAh will open up a fountain for the Jewish people to wash away their sin. In short, this 1/3 of the Jewish people who are not destroyed in the last days (Zech 13:8,9) will be saved in one day by humbling themselves as they see Yeshua return, recognizing that they caused The Wounds they see in Him (Zech 13:6)
7	7	15	Feast of Tabernacles Lev 23:33-43 Sukkot	After the "ingathering" of the produce of the land (v. 39) Israel was to have an 8 day celebration "in the presence" of YehovAh. They were to live outside in temporary dwellings just as they had in their 40 journey through the wilderness before God brought them into the Land. This was to remind them that He guided Israel via His Manifest Presence expressed as the Cloud by day and the Fire by night.	THE GATHERING of YESHUA'S FOLLOWERS TO HIMSELF In John 7:37ff and John 8:12ff Yeshua, on the last day of Sukkot (the GREAT HOSSANA (Hoshana Rabba)) taught on having the Living Water and having the Light of Life (pictures of Yeshua's Presence with us, in good measure NOW , AND assurance that one day we will go to always be with Him.) Sukkot is all about knowing God's Presence with us, leaving our earthly dwellings, and seeing Him as more necessary that the light of the Sun. 1 Thessalonias 4:16-18 says we are to be comforted by the fact that one day Yeshua will gather us to Himself and so "shall we ever be with JehovAh." This will happen at the FINAL Trumpet's sounding (1 Corinthians 15:52). "The Tabernacle of God" will be with men (Revelation 21:3).
				Elsewhere in The Torah (Numbers 29:12ff) instructions are given for 70 bulls to be sacrificed over the course of Sukkot, representing a sacrifice for each and every nation of the world. Solomon dedicated The Temple on Sukkot (2 Chron 7).
